# A Special Thank You to MICHAEL MILLER



To mark a well-earned retirement, members of the Tri-County Tourism Alliance wish to formally recognize and thank Michael Miller, Emeritus Director of the Germans from Russia Heritage Collection at NDSU Libraries for his dedication, contributions, and continued support of the Alliance. As an extension of Michael's 55 years of tireless efforts at NDSU, the Alliance has benefited greatly from his "lifelong dream to preserve, document, and enrich the heritage and culture of our Germans from Russia community."

## Born and raised in Strasburg, ND, Michael lived and learned first-hand the rich German Russian traditions. In 1967, he was named to the faculty of North Dakota State University, Fargo to teach library science, act as circulation librarian, and handle the library displays. In 1978, then NDSU President Loftsgard asked Michael to create the Germans from Russia Heritage Collection. A role he continued as bibliographer and eventual Director until his retirement in December 2022.

During Michael's time at NDSU and working with the Alliance, his accomplishments have benefited Germans from Russia around the globe and most definitely the many neighbors and friends in Emmons, McIntosh, and Logan counties. Since November 1996, he has written a monthly column titled "In Touch with Prairie Living" which he plans to continue.

Michael has been an executive producer on ten award-winning documentaries for Prairie Public Television that focus on Germans from Russian heritage and culture. In his rare spare time from 1996 to 2019 he also led twentythree *Journey to the Homeland* tours allowing hundreds of German-Russians to directly experience the homeland of their ancestors and in some cases connect with distant family members.

Fortunately for us all, Michael remains committed to providing guidance and input on special GRHC and Alliance projects after his official retirement. Michael, from a grateful tri-county community of Germans from Russia, we all look forward to many more opportunities to learn and be moved by your passion for our shared heritage.
